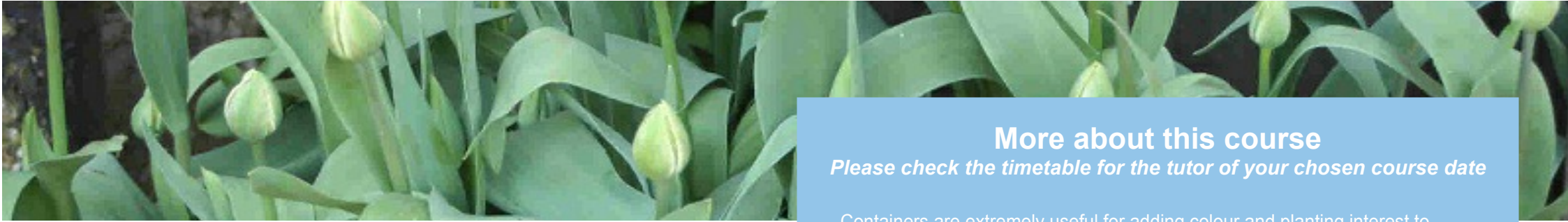


One Day Container Gardening Course

Containers also allow you to broaden your planting palette as plants that may not be suitable for growing in your garden soil can be given just the conditions they need in a container.

If you live with alkaline soil and want to grow blueberries or azaleas then containers are the way to go.

Containers can also be extremely useful for temporary gap filling in the borders during those tricky times of year.

We will also discuss good choices of plants and where to find them at great prices so that you can be truly generous with your own creations and learn how bulbs can be in flower at any time of year.

No longer just the realm of brightly coloured bedding plants, we will investigate how some of the top designers are using containers both for clients and in their show gardens.
